The Secure Rural Schools and Community Self Determination Act of 2000

As you are aware, the federal law relating to the Federal Forest Reserve has had significant changes that require action from the counties. This is the middle of October and the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self Determination Act of 2000 states that designations (elections) for Title II and Title III funds should have been received in Washington by September 30, 2003. Well, we didn't meet the deadline due to the fact that the information mailed to the State of New Mexico was never received by the Department of Finance and Administration. Therefore, it is urgent that counties submit their election results along with the attached worksheet to the Local Government Division no later than October 31, 2003:

Counties with National Forest lands have two decision points this month in connection with their 25 percent payments.

First, any county that has elected to continue to receive its' payments under the old formula of the 1908 Twenty-five Percent Act now has a chance to change to the new formula, under the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self Determination Act of 2000. Based on the attached spreadsheet, the change to the new formula may provide an increase in the distribution to your respective county.

Second, counties that do elect to be paid under the terms of the new Act, and that received more than \$100,000 a year must designate between a minimum of 15 percent and a maximum of 20 percent of their payments for Title II and/or Title III. This requirement applies to all such counties; it is an annual requirement. The county commission must vote on which method of payment they want to go with.

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Counties that chose to stay with the traditional 25% payment system should not be reported on this form. Counties that chose the new P.L. 106-393 "full payment amount" must complete the attached form and must report a Title II and/or Title III election this year.
