4 5 6	DECLARING TORRANCE COUNTY TO BE A SECOND AMENDMENT SANCTUARY COUNTY	
7 8	WHEREAS, NMSA 1978, Section 4-37-1 (1995) provides that Counties have the power	
9	to, "provide for the safety, preserve the health, promote the prosperity and improve the morals,	
10	order, comfort and convenience of any county or its inhabitants"; and,	
11	WHEREAS, NMSA, 1978, Section 4-38-18 (1976) provides that a Board of County	
12	Commissioner has the duty and authority "[t]o represent the county and have the care of the	
13	county property and the management of the interest of the county in all cases where no other	
14	provision is made by law; and,	
15	WHEREAS, firearms training, shooting sports, hunting, and self-protection through the	
16	use of firearms is a traditional and necessary part of life in Torrance county; and,	
17	WHEREAS, the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution, adopted in 1791	
18	as part of the Bill of Rights, protects the inalienable and individual right of the people to keep	
19	and bear arms; and,	
20	WHEREAS, the Supreme Court in the District of Columbia v. Heller 554 U.S. 570	
21	(2008), decision affirmed an individual's right to possess firearms, unconnected with service in a	
22	militia, for traditionally lawful purposes, such as self-defense within the home; and,	
23	WHEREAS, the Supreme Court in McDonald v. Chicago, 561 U.S. 742 (2010), affirmed	
24	that the right of an individual to "keep and bear arms," as protected under the Second	
25	Amendment, is incorporated by the Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment against	
26	the states; and,	

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court, in United States v. Miller, 307 U.S. 174 (1939), opined that firearms that are part of ordinary military equipment, or with use that could contribute to the common defense are protected by the Second Amendment; and,

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 6 of the Constitution of New Mexico provides that "[n]o law shall abridge the right of the citizen to keep and bear arms for security and defense, for lawful hunting and recreational use and for other lawful purposes, but nothing herein shall be held to permit the carrying of concealed weapons. No municipality or county shall regulate, in any way, an incident of the right to keep and bear arms;" and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board to declare its support of the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution and the New Mexico Constitution protecting citizens' inalienable and individual right to keep and bear arms; and,

WHEREAS, the members of this Board took an oath to support and defend the United States Constitution, the Constitution of the State of New Mexico and the laws of the State of New Mexico; and,

WHEREAS, enforcement of any state law that violates the United States Constitution or the Constitution of the State of New Mexico would be a violation of our oath of office; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Torrance by the authority granted by the laws of The State of New Mexico and people of Torrance County to stand and defend their rights and liberties, which are guaranteed by the United States and New Mexico Constitutions, do hereby declare the County of Torrance as a Second Amendment Sanctuary County where the rights and privileges guaranteed by the Second Amendment of the United State Constitution are preserved.

1	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Board affirms its support for the duly elected		
2	Sheriff of Torrance County, New Mexico in the exerc	sise of their sound discretion and affirms its	
3	resolve to support decisions by our Sheriff to not enforce any unconstitutional firearms law		
4	4 against any citizen. This provision shall not be construed to include persons convicted of violent		
5	felonies.		
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Bo	ard will not authorize or appropriate	
7	government funds, resources, employees, agencies, co	ontractors, buildings, detention centers or	
8	offices for the purpose of enforcing law that unconstit	tutionally infringes on the right of the	
9	people to keep and bear arms.

RE: PNM BB2 Transmission Line Case No. 18-00243-UT

We are writing to you in support of Public Service Company of New Mexico's (PNM) application for Commission approvals of the proposed BB2 transmission line, currently pending before you in Case No. 18-00243-UT. We understand this transmission line is necessary to accommodate new renewable generation and for PNM to serve its customers, including Facebook's Las Lunas data center. I hope you will join us in encouraging renewable energy development in New Mexico.

As you may know, the El Cabo Wind project was recently completed in Torrance County. The construction and ongoing operation of the El Cabo project has and will continue to result in millions of dollars of economic benefit for our Community. The El Cabo project generated over 400 jobs during construction, and resulted in 17 new well-paying jobs to operate and maintain the project. Torrance County also benefits from PILOT payments from the project. It is our understanding that the BB2 line would allow PNM to accept more wind generation from Torrance County and other areas on its transmission grid. This line would, therefore, enable additional wind project development and the accompanying economic development in Torrance County.

We hope you will join the Torrance County Commission in supporting this economic development in rural areas. We encourage you to approve PNM's application in the public interest.
