WHEREAS, The New Mexico Legislature passed and the Governor signed into law, the "Enhanced 911 Act" to provide an enhanced

911 system for reporting police, fire, and other emergency

situations, and

WHEREAS, Because it is the responsibility of the commission to provide for the safety, preserve the health, promote the prosperity and improve the morals, order, comfort and convenience of their county and its inhabitants, the commission wishes to provide the "E911" service to its

citizens, and

WHEREAS, In order to effectively put into place in Torrance County

the "E911" service, it is necessary to alter the boundaries of the volunteer fire departments so as to more efficiently

cover the entire area of Torrance County, and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Commission wishes to change the former boundaries of McIntosh Fire District to meet the boundaries

of other county fire districts, more particularly described

in the attached map and legal description.

THEREFORE. The Commission respectfully requests that the State Fire

Marshal and Insurance Services Office accept and certify

these new boundaries for McIntosh Fire District.
