2. Law Enforcement Protection Fund (LEPF)

The state imposes taxes on insurance policies every year to pay for things like improved fire services and protecting law enforcement officers, yet every year millions of dollars have been taken from those funds to help pay for other areas in state government. The fire fund was recently fixed, now that momentum is needed to keep the state from taking money from the LEPF. The \$5-\$6 million dollars that goes back into the State General Fund should be going to local law enforcement agencies to enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of law enforcement services.
