R 2022-55 4 5 Resolution Supporting the New Mexico Counties 6 7 2023 Legislative Priorities 8 WHEREAS, in September 2022, the New Mexico Counties Board of Directors approved four 9 legislative priorities for consideration by the New Mexico Legislature at its 2023 session; and 10 11 WHEREAS, NMC has requested that the Board of County Commissioners in each of the state's 33 12 counties discuss and approve support for NMC's legislative priorities as an important step in 13 assuring maximum understanding of NMC's legislative priorities at the county level; and 14 15 WHEREAS, county support enables NMC to demonstrate strong local and statewide support to 16 17 the state legislature for the following issues: 18 1. HB 2 Appropriations 19 **Detention Reimbursement Fund** 20 Increase the County Detention Facilities Reimbursement Act fund to reimburse counties for 21 the cost of housing New Mexico Corrections Department (NMCD) inmates. 22 Currently the fund is \$5 million. 23 According to the New Mexico Sentencing Commission, the five-year average cost to 24 25 house NMCD inmates is \$7.5 million. 26 Prisoner Transport and Extradition 27 Create a line item in the DFA budget with \$750,000 to reimburse counties that provide 28 transportation for state prisoners. 29 Statute 4-44-18C NMSA requires the state to make such payment. 30 Counties should not be responsible to pay for state prisoner extradition. 31 32 33 Emergency Medical Services Create a line item in the Department of Health Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Bureau 34 budget with \$10 million to assist local government emergency medical services. 35 Emergency medical services in New Mexico have been significantly underfunded for 36 37 years. Current state appropriations, taxes collected through local GRT increments, and other 38 sources of revenue do not provide sufficient support to local governments to meet 39 community needs, especially in rural areas of the state. 40 Emergency medical services are vital to the health and welfare of New Mexico citizens. 41 42 43 2. Public Safety Package Return to Work 44 Local governments struggle to fill critical public safety positions. 45 Allowing able and willing retirees to return to work would create a pool of qualified 46 applicants to fill essential public safety positions. 47 48

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Recruitment and Retention 1 Sufficient numbers of detention staff are essential to a safe and well-operated detention 2 3 facility which is directly correlated to community safety. 4 A public safety recruitment and retention fund would provide local governments with 5 much needed resources to provide detention services to their communities. 6 7 Staffing Crisis in Fire & EMS Create a Fire and EMS fund at \$50 million to support volunteer and paid staff. 8 Many New Mexico fire departments are volunteer or combination departments; number 9 of volunteers has greatly declined. 10 Call volume and large events continues to rise in New Mexico. 11 12 3. Courthouse Funding 13 Create a fund for construction and renovation for state district courthouses. 14 15 4. IPRA Election Related Records & Data 16 17 Clearly define how IPRA relates to election records and data. Need clear guidance on many aspects related to elections records and data that may be 18 19 subject to IPRA. 20 (2) NMSA 1-12-69.
