1.) CALL MEETING TO ORDER

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> calls the November 11th, 2020 Commission Meeting to order at 9:00 A.M.

2.) Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Invocation lead by Commissioner McCall

3.) Changes to the Agenda

Madam County Manager Barela states that there are a few changes to the agenda. The first request is to move agenda item 5-C to be presented with the Proclamations in agenda item #4.

The next request is to move agenda item #13-A to be presented right after public comment, as the presenters cannot stay for the whole meeting because they need to return to work.

The last request is for a correction to the statute number in executive session. The "4" needs to be removed leaving the statute to read as NMSA section 10-15-1(H)(2).

4.) PROCLAMATIONS

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> states that the Commission would like to recognize the Veterans that are County Employees as today is Veterans Day. Chairman Schwebach will now read the names of the employees and what branch of the military they are in.

c.) GRANTS: Recognition for the Torrance County Complete Count Committee.

<u>Cheryl Allen</u>, Torrance County Grants Manager, states that she would like to recognize the Complete Count Committee for all their hard work during the census period. Ms. Allen is presenting them with a proclamation and reads it for the record. (hereto attached)

Ms. Allen hands out the proclamations and mentions that Shannon Cobb took over at the last minute as the Complete Count Committee Chair. Ms. Allen now recognizes Ms. Cobb, formally, as the Complete Count Committee Chair.

<u>Peggy Schwebach</u> states that this was a great group that was put together. The group soldiered on no matter what. She appreciates that she was able to be a part of this committee. She enjoyed working with the community and learning new things about the county. Ms. Schwebach would also like to give a big thanks to Ms. Cobb for all her hard work and to the radio station KXNM for everything they did as well.

Kassandra Sandy would like to second what Peggy said and would like to give a big thanks to Ms. Schwebach for setting the tone and keeping us on a straight path. Ms. Sandy would also like to thank Shannon for all her hard work. Also, a big thank you to the Complete Count Committee for all their work and to the County Commission for allowing her to be given the opportunity to be part of this.

Ms. Sandy would also like to thank Ms. Allen for all the hard work that she put into this. She worked even on her own time to keep this working as smoothly as it did.

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> would also like to thank the Complete Count Committee for all their hard work and dedication to the Census 2020 work. The work is strictly volunteer, so for them to go out and work as hard as they have it is greatly appreciated.

5.) CERTIFICATES and AWARDS

a.) MANAGER: Presentation of Memorial Plaque for D'Aun "Dee Dee" Sedillo Zamora.

Madam County Manager Barela states that she has asked the County Assessor, Jesse Lucero, to present this plaque.

<u>Jesse Lucero</u>, Torrance County Assessor, states that this is a tough subject for his office. For those that knew Dee Dee, both professionally and personally, know that she joined her husband in Heaven on October 7th, 2019. Today we will be celebrating the memory of D'Aun Rufina "Dee Dee" Sedillo Zamora. Plaques will be presented to the parents of Dee Dee and the Assessor's office. Mr. Lucero reads a short paragraph about Dee Dee's history with the County and then a few statements from close friends that she worked with here at the county.

Mr. Lucero presents the plaques to the Commission and to Lola Sedillo, Dee Dee's Mom, and to the Assessor's office, along with a photo that will stay posted in their office.

b.) MANAGER: Presentation of Retirement Plaques for Linda Jaramillo and Linda Kayser.

<u>Madam County Manager Barela</u> states that she will be presenting retirement plaques to Linda Jaramillo and Linda Kayser. Madam County Manager Barela states that everyone around knows them as the Linda's. They have made an amazing team. She appreciates all the hard work that they have done for the County and its citizens.

Linda Jaramillo came in as the newly elected clerk in 1996 and then bought in Linda Kayser to be her deputy in 1999. Since then they have taken turns in their positions and have maintained a great watchguard over the election process and have instilled great confidence in the election process. They have been amazing at their job.

Since they have been in office there have been many changes with the election process. They have learned new voting machines, brought in an alternate early voting location, and have made the county totally accessible for voting by bringing in the Voting Convenience Centers. They have also given the task of running the Local Elections that include the municipalities, school boards, and Soil and Water Conservations Districts. There most challenging election was their last one. They were challenged with running an election during a pandemic, but they pulled it through as they would have any other election.

Madam County Manager Barela states that she appreciates the Linda's as well as the staff that have supported them through all the years and reads from the plaque that is being presented to the Linda's.

<u>Linda Kayser</u>, Chief Deputy Clerk, would like to thank everyone for being so wonderful with herself and Linda. The office as well as the other employees in the building, it has been a pleasure to work with everyone. She would also like to thank the citizens for trusting her and Linda all these years. She is sad the Linda could not be here, but circumstances as they are, it prevented her from being able to attend.

<u>Madam County Manager Barela</u> states that Linda Jaramillo's plaque reads the same, but the years of service are different. She will get the plaque to her when she comes back to work.

<u>Commissioner McCall</u> states this is exciting and wishes things like this could be done at every meeting. Commissioner McCall states that Linda said it very well that this staff works hard. As a Commissioner he is very appreciative of the staff and all the hard work they put in. He will miss the Linda's and in the 2 years he has been Commissioner, the elections have been handled well, and he appreciates that. Thank you to the veterans, to Dee Dee's Family, and to Torrance County.

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> states that he would like to add a comment concerning the retiring Linda's. Chairman Schwebach states that he was having a conversation with a good friend about all the commotion going on with this years election, that friend turned to him and stated, not every county is fortunate enough to have the Linda's running their election.

Chairman Schwebach states that he has worked with the Linda's for many elections, rest assured that things like what is going on in other areas just does not happen here. They have done a second to none job. Thank you for all you have done and wishes them good luck in their future endeavors.

7.) PUBLIC COMMENT and COMMUNICATIONS

- a.) Matt Propp. Emergency Manager, wants to give a quick update concerning the Covid-19 issues in the county. Mr. Propp is happy to report that Torrance County is still one of the counties that is still in the green, meaning we have very few cases of Covid-19. There are currently 78 active cases, 44 cases at CCA, 22 that are considered active. Mr. Propp gives a break down as to how they come up with the cases that keep us in the green.

- **a.) GRANTS:** Presentation by the Complete Count Committee of iPads and anti-theft states for use at the Estancia, Moriarty, and Mountainair Senior Centers.

Cheryl Allen, Grants Manager, introduces Angela Creamer.

<u>Angela Creamer</u> states that on behalf of Torrance County, she would like to present an iPad with security stands, to the senior centers in Estancia, Mountainair, and Moriarty. Ms. Creamer states that she also has hats to give to the Commissioners from the Complete Count Committee.

<u>Cheryl Allen</u> states that these iPads were originally purchased for use by the Complete Count Committee to be used at various events that were to have happened around the county, but all were canceled because of the corona virus. The iPads will be put to good use and not just stashed away.

<u>Angie Coburn</u> states that on behalf of the Senior Centers, she would like to thank the Commission for their support during the pandemic. The centers are closed right now but are continuing to do the grab and go meals and the home deliveries to those seniors that need them.

Ms. Coburn states that the services that are currently being provided were only set in place because of the pandemic. Once the centers reopen we would like to keep those services going, so we need to talk to the senators and representatives to keep these services open, Again she would also like to thank the commission for everything they do and for all their support.

a.) FINANCE: Approval of Payables

ACTION TAKEN: <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> makes a motion a approve the consent agenda, approval of payables. <u>Commissioner McCall</u> seconds the motion. No discussion. All Commissioners in favor. <u>MOTION CARRIED</u>

10.) ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE/AMENDMENT TO COUNTY CODE

There were none presented.

11.) ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION

a.) FINANCE: Motion to Approve Disposition of computers and firearms, Resolution No. 2020-43.

ACTION TAKEN: <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> makes a motion to approve the disposition of computer and firearms, Resolution No. 2020-43. <u>Commissioner McCall</u> seconds the motion.

<u>Jeremy Oliver</u>, Finance Director, states that there are some computers and devices that are obsolete and need to have the hard drives destroyed and the Sheriff's department has some old firearms that need to be disposed of as well. Mr. Oliver states that the cost for each disposal was just under \$500.00.

<u>Commissioner McCall</u> asks Mr. Oliver if he has any information on where the firearms are being sent to.

<u>Jeremy Oliver</u> states that the Sheriff has that information as they have been dealing with a few vendors to get the best deal.

<u>Sheriff Rivera</u> states that they have replaced their firearms with new ones. The only way to dispose of the old firearms is to go through a dealer. After looking around they finally found a dealer that offered them \$5,000.00 more than a previous vendor. No further discussion, all Commissioners in favor. **MOTION CARRIED**

12.) APPROVALS

a.) SHERIFF: Motion to submit application for Firehouse Subs to purchase radios for the Torrance County Sheriff's Office.

ACTION TAKEN: <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> makes a motion to submit an application for Firehouse Subs to purchase radios for the Torrance County Sheriff's Office. <u>Commissioner McCall</u> seconds the motion.

<u>Cheryl Allen</u> states that this a grant from the Firehouse Subs grant foundation. She is requesting permission to submit this application, its an online application and is due today. This is to purchase 4 L3Harris XL-200P Multiband Radios. The request is for exact funding from the exact quote. The amount being requested is \$23,248.10. The radios are compatible with the First Net system and the current VHF network. If this grant is awarded Firehouse Subs will make the purchase and then present the radios to Torrance County.

<u>Sheriff Rivera</u> states that he has tested the Harris radios and they work well. The radios are also compatible with the current systems. The department is in need to new radios and this would be a great asset.

<u>Matt Propp</u> echoes what Sheriff Rivera has stated and states the Emergency Management purchased two of these radios last year. They work great, great multiband compatibility, you can talk universally, its just a great radio overall.

<u>Commissioner McCall</u> asks how many radios are currently in use by the Sheriff's department, and how many would the department need?

<u>Stephanie Dunlap</u> states that the department currently as 23 radios in use and they all need to be replaced. The department will be asking for funding next fiscal year or have Cheryl look for another grant.

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> states that he is looking at the bid, would it be safe to say that the \$23,248.10 divided by 4, would be the total cost of each radio?

<u>Matt Propp</u> replies, yes, that is correct. There are other options for radios out there, but this radio was the only one compatible with the LT system and the only one that does not charge a monthly maintenance fee.

<u>John Butrick</u>, County Attorney, asks Ms. Allen if she was able to get more information concerning the anti-donation clause.

<u>Cheryl Allen</u> states that in the grant agreement the county must agree to a photo op with Firehouse Subs. To be eligible for the funding we must be within 60 miles of the business, and we are within that range. The business is also requesting that a sticker be affixed to the radio, not a sticker to advertise for Firehouse Subs, but a property inventory sticker to be able to track the location of the device.

<u>John Butrick</u> would like to thank Ms. Allen for catching that and bringing it to his attention. No further discussion, all Commissioners in favor. **MOTION CARRIED**

b.) SHERIFF: Motion to approve Ratification of Traffic Safety Grant Agreement between Torrance County and New Mexico Department of Transportation Safety Division.

ACTION TAKEN: <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> makes a motion to approve Ratification of Traffic Safety Grant Agreement between Torrance County and New Mexico Department of Transportation Safety Division. <u>Commissioner McCall</u> seconds the motion.

<u>Cheryl Allen</u> states that this grant is to fund the END DWI, Buckle-Up and STEP projects. There is separate funding for each of these projects. The END DWI is in the amount of \$2,160.00, Buckle-Up is in the amount of \$2,790.00, and STEP is in the amount of \$2,820.00. These funds serve to cover overtime expenses for officers that are patrolling during these events.

Ms. Allen would like to state that when this was created there was a cap set on the amount of pay per hour the officer could receive. The cap on that is \$30.00, it was set by NMDOT. The county is unable to cap at that amount as we are required to follow our HR Policy. After speaking with Mr. Oliver there will be an amount not anticipated by the county and is estimated at \$487.90 that is not covered by the grant.

<u>Madam County Manager Barela</u> states that she spoke with Sheriff Rivera and depending on the officer that was sent to the event, the pay would be based on that officer's salary. If the OT exceeded the cap, it would be covered by the OT line-item in the Sheriff's Dept.

Stephanie Dunlap states that she did speak with the state and the cap is set by the state and the whole time she has been working with the department they have always had to pay an overage. The budget does allow for the overage. **Chairman Schwebach** asks if there is any further discussion. There being none, all Commissioners in favor. **MOTION CARRIED**

c.) PURCHASING: Motion to Approve Contract Fully Insured Medical and Prescription Drug Coverage-Presbyterian Health Plan Inc.

ACTION TAKE: <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> makes a motion to approve Contract for Fully Insured Medical and Prescription Drug Coverage-Presbyterian Health Plan Inc. <u>Commissioner McCall</u> seconds the motion.

<u>Jeremy Oliver</u>, Finance Director, states that Noah Sedillo was not able to attend today's meeting to present this item. The county did an RFP for medical and prescription drug coverage in conjunction with Gallagher, the county's medical broker. The award was given to Presbyterian, who is our current provider, and they scored 881 out of 1000. The only other proposal received was from True Health NM and they scored lower at 763 out of 1000.

There will also be a financial savings of 7.19% across the board. This means that our rates should be a little lower this year.

Commissioner McCall asks if this is the same policy the county currently has.

Kristin Oliver, HR Director, states that the plan is the same, the rates are what changed.

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> states that as he understands this, it is the same plan, but Madam County Manager Barela, asked them if they could lower the rate?

<u>Madam County Manager Barela</u>, yes, the committee instructed Noah to talk to the broker and see if the broker could speak with PMS about a lower rate. The rate will be locked in for two years, and after that it will go up by about 2%.

<u>Kristin Oliver</u> states that the bid was already lower than the current rates and PMS was asked if they could make the rates better than that.

John Butrick states that this price is guaranteed for 2 years.

<u>Commissioner McCall</u> asks Ms. Oliver if she has heard any complaints from the employees concerning the current insurance coverage.

<u>Kristin Oliver</u> states that she did send out a survey to the employees and asked if they were happy with their current coverage or if they would like to switch to something cheaper, and a majority of the employees responded that they were happy with their current coverage. There being no further discussion, all Commissioners in favor. **MOTION CARRIED**

d.) MANAGER: Motion to concur with the hiring of Philip Tenorio as the Torrance County Deputy County Manager at the terms and conditions set forth in the contract offered by the County Manager.

ACTION TAKEN: <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> makes a motion to concur with the hiring of Philip Tenorio as the Torrance County Deputy County Manager at the terms and conditions set forth in the contract offered by the County Manager.

<u>Madam County Manager Barela</u> states that she is excited to have the opportunity to have as the Deputy County Manager, Mr. Philip Tenorio. Madam County Manager Barela is asking for

the Commission's approval to hire Mr. Tenorio as the Deputy County Manager. Mr. Tenorio has been with the county for 2 weeks and has already proven that he will be a great asset to the county. **Commissioner McCall** seconds the motion. No further discussion, all Commissioners in favor. **MOTION CARRIED**

e.) CLERK: Motion to submit application for Regrant Program, of the New Mexico Historical Records Advisory Board (NMHRAB) to request funding to preserve and digitize records.

ACTION TAKEN: <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> makes a motion to submit application for Regrant Program, of the New Mexico Historical Records Advisory Board (NMHRAB) to request funding to preserve and digitize records. <u>Commissioner McCall</u> seconds the motion.

<u>Cheryl Allen</u> states that she is requesting the approval of the Commission to apply for the Regrant Program of the New Mexico Historical Records Advisory Board. This application is due on December 1, 2020. The maximum grant award amount is \$8,500.00 and we are going to request on that max based upon the current quote that we will receive. This grant will require a match of 25% which is \$2,125.00.

Ms. Allen states that because of the election and how busy the clerk has been, we have not been able to obtain a new quote, so the numbers on this could change. The clerk is looking on doing a full restoration on 6 books that are in the Clerk's office that are categorized in the most critical need of being restored. The estimated total to restore all the books that are in the Clerk's office is about \$60,000.00. Ms. Allen states that she has not been able to obtain a grant that would cover the cost, so we are looking at getting the work done as we are able to.

This is the first step in the process. This amount would cover the restoration of the 6 books that are extremely damaged. The full restoration of one book is estimated at \$1,500.00. This is an old estimate so a new estimate may be higher or lower.

The focus of the NMHRAB is preservation, and this is what would be doing with these books. The total with the grant and the match the county must pay is \$10,625.00.

Commissioner McCall asks what budget the county's portion would come out of.

<u>Jeremy Oliver</u> states that there is savings in the General Fund, PILT, infrastructure, there are a few places in savings and GRT's. The money can be moved to the Clerk's budget. It's a small amount so there are options on where the money can come from.

There being no further discussion, <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> & <u>Commissioner McCall</u> vote yes, <u>Commissioner Sanchez</u> is absent. <u>MOTION CARRIED</u>

f.) CLERK: Motion to approve Canvass of 2020 General Election Results.

<u>Linda Kayser</u>, Chief Deputy Clerk, states that she is here today to present the canvass results for the November 3rd, 2020 General Election. First off Ms. Kayser would like to thank all the precinct workers for all the hard work they did working the polling locations. From keeping everything cleaned and sterile after a person voted and to all those that were running around all

day collecting absentee ballots. Ms. Kayser also apologizes for County Clerk Linda Jaramillo not being present at today's meeting, as she had a family emergency and needed to be there.

Ms. Kayser states that there was 7,332 people that voted in the General Election. That was 75.8% of the voters that voted.

Ms. Kayser proceeds with the canvass. There were 10 provisional ballots that were processed and all of them counted. The absentee board counted and tallied all the votes this year. The provisional ballots were from individuals that did not receive their absentee ballot in the mail, so they could vote provisional. Before the ballot gets counted, we must make sure that they are registered to vote. Everyone was registered. There was one individual that was not in the systems but had registered in person with a 3rd party registrant and the registration was never returned to the office. The voter has his receipt so were able to count his vote as well and he will be added in after the election.

<u>Commissioner McCall</u> asks Ms. Kayser, If a person that has requested a ballot, but has yet to receive it, the system will have the voter flagged and let the poll worker know that this person may have received a ballot and it will not allow them to vote, correct?

<u>Linda Kayser</u> replies, yes, that is correct. The BOD will alert the Presiding Judge that the person received an absentee ballot. If they did not receive the ballot then the voter can sign an affidavit of non-receipt and the absentee request will be canceled, and new ballot will be printed allowing the voter to vote in person.

Ms. Kayser states that there were 38 ballots that could not be passed through the machine, so they had to be hand tallied. There were 19 Federally Qualified Electors, which are over seas voters or active military. These votes cannot be run through a machine because there are received through email, so they needed to be hand tallied. Out of the 22 that were requested 4 did not come back to us. All the 19 UOCAVA ballots were counted. There was a total of 71 hand tallies.

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> asks Ms. Kayser if she has the total number of absentee ballots that were requested but not returned.

<u>Linda Kayser</u> states that she did not pull that number for the Commission, if they want it she can get it for them. Ms. Kayser states that there were some ballots that never made it to us.

Ms. Kayser shows the Commission the tabulator report and explains that her and Ms. Jaramillo went through each tape to make sure that all the numbers matched, as did the girls in the office, and election night as they were processing votes into the RTR system. All these reports are also sent to the S.O.S. as they do a complete canvass as well and inform us of things that may not be correct and allow us to make corrections.

Chairman Schwebach asks Ms. Kayser to explain the "Tape" what makes the tape so special.

<u>Linda Kayser</u> states that the tape is what comes out of the voting machine that has all the results of what was voted on that machine. Ms. Kayser reads the explanations of items that were corrected, and then reads off the list of winners in Torrance County. (documents hereto attached)

ACTION TAKEN: <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> makes a motion to approve Canvass of 2020 General Election Results. <u>Commissioner McCall</u> seconds the motion. Chairman Schwebach and Commissioner McCall vote yes, Commissioner Sanchez is absent, 2 Commissioners in favor. **MOTION CARRIED**

g.) HUMAN RESOURCES: Motion to approve the 2021 Commission Meeting and Holiday Schedule.

Kristin Oliver, HR Director, states that she is presenting the Commission with two schedules. The holidays are the same on both schedules, but on schedule B there are no Commission Meetings right before the holidays. The reason for this is because last year the Commission requested that there not be a meeting right before the holiday.

Ms. Oliver states that she would like to bring up another topic with the holidays. In the policy it states that the Commission will set the dates, but there is also a part that states when a holiday falls on a regular day off, that holiday will be observed on a Friday or Monday. We have not been doing it that way. We have just been observing the holidays on the days they fall on, and if it was on the weekend, we did not observe it at all. What we have been doing is letting the employee use that day as a floating holiday and it can be used 30 days before or after the holiday. Ms. Oliver suggests leaving it as and then we can adjust the policy at a later time.

Commissioner McCall asks the administration if they are ok with schedule B.

<u>Madam County Manager Barela</u> states that they are able to plan ahead enough to get all the necessary items on the agenda.

ACTION TAKEN: <u>Commissioner McCall</u> makes a motion to approve the 2021 Commission Meeting and Holiday Schedule B. <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> seconds the motion. Chairman Schwebach states that he is ok with Schedule B, but with schedule A seems more feasible as a meeting can be cancelled if need be. On the other hand, if there is something that needs to get done, a special meeting can be done. <u>Madam County Manager Barela</u> replies, yes, that is correct. A special meeting can be called, and it will follow the same procedure as a regular meeting. <u>Commissioner McCall</u> states that he likes schedule B because the staff will not have to worry if there will be a meeting or not and if needed, a special meeting can be called. Chairman Schwebach and Commissioner McCall vote yes, Commissioner Sanchez is absent, 2 Commissioners in favor. **MOTION CARRIED**

h.) DWI: Motion to approve Local DWI Grant Amendment Number 1, amount includes the \$14,1888.00 Reversion amount from FY2020.

ACTION TAKEN: <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> makes a motion to approve Local DWI Grant Amendment Number 1, amount includes the \$14,188.00 Reversion amount from FY2020.

<u>Tracey Master</u>, DWI Coordinator, states that the Commission has before them grant #21-D-G-31 Amendment #1. This was originally awarded earlier in the year but then was reverted back to DFA. The DFA re-awarded us the grant and came larger than anticipated. This makes the total

grant amount to \$84,188.00. This has gone before the Grant Committee and Legal and there were no issues. The money will be spent on advertising and promoting DWI prevention.

<u>Commissioner McCall</u> states as he sees it there is an in-kind amount of \$17,900.00, this is the amount that the county must come up with, is that correct?

<u>Tracey Master</u> replies, yes & no, its in-kind that is demonstrated on the paperwork. This is the office space that is provided, utilities, use of vehicle, vehicle insurance, and a few other things. There is about 40% to 50% of the in-kind.

<u>John Butrick</u> asks Ms. Master if the number changed. When he spoke with Ms. Allen, it was mentioned that the number may have changed.

<u>Tracey Master</u> states that the number has not changed. <u>Commissioner McCall</u> seconds the motion. No further discussion, all Commissioners in favor. **MOTION CARRIED**

i.) PURCHASING: Motion to approve Interlocal Contract for Cooperative Purchasing with Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC).

ACTION TAKEN: <u>Chairman Schwebach</u> makes a motion to approve Interlocal Contract for Cooperative Purchasing with Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC). <u>Commissioner McCall</u> seconds the motion.

<u>Jeremy Oliver</u> states that this is to be able to use the HGAC for a procurement agent. This agency will be used for large ticket items such as fire trucks, road department equipment, etc. Their fee is based per PO and will save time on purchases and have been guaranteed a competitive bid process on any purchases that would go through HGAC.

<u>John Butrick</u> states that he has worked with the Chief Procurement Officer on this. This is nice because there is no cost, and the fee's come when a purchase is made. There is no fee per item, if 5 items are purchased then only 1 fee is charged. Mr. Butrick likes this because it gives the county another procurement option and competitive bids.

<u>Matt Propp</u> states that this contract is great because the fire department is limited when purchasing any fire apparatus. There is no vendor in the state of New Mexico that builds the necessary equipment. This company will check to see if there is a company that would work better for our needs, it also cuts the time since we will not have to do an RFP. We will have more options. A lot of the counties are switching to HGAC because of this.

<u>John Butrick</u> states that the Commission may notice a water mark on the contract stating that this is not for execution, but this is the contract and it is just a matter of going online and finishing the process there.

<u>Commissioner McCall</u> asks what the county was using before, and to verify there is no cost, correct?

<u>Jeremy Oliver</u> states that the last purchase was through a competitive bid process which does not offer the best rate available. Mr. Oliver also states that there is no cost, the only cost is when a purchase is made. The additional fee is \$2,000.00.

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> asks if this is a procurement option, but not to be used on all procurement, correct? This comes in handy for larger purchases made from state, correct?

<u>Jeremy Oliver</u> replies, yes, that is correct. If the county can do better going out for bid or through a state contract, the county will use the best option available. Chairman Schwebach and Commissioner McCall vote yes, Commissioner Sanchez is absent, 2 Commissioners in favor. **MOTION CARRIED**

13.) DISCUSSION

a.) Agenda Item Moved to be presented after Public Comment and Communications

b.) GRANTS: Establish schedule and process for presenting the 2022-2026 (ICIP) plans for Torrance County and its senior centers to the State Senators and Representatives representing Torrance County.

<u>Cheryl Allen</u> states that this was presented last year during a Commission Meeting. Due to the Covid-19 restrictions she is wanting to know how the Commission is wanting to present this to the Representatives. The options that are presented are to have them presented at the next Commission meeting on December 9th or to set up a Zoom meeting and have one Commissioner Present as to not to have to call a special meeting. Ms. Allen thinks that more attendance will happen if this is presented via Zoom.

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> asks Ms. Allen how she knows that there will be more attendance Via Zoom. Is it just a guess or has she spoke with the representatives on this?

<u>Madam County Manager Barela</u> states that she has spoken with a Representative and they feel it would be best to be presented during a Zoom meeting. Madam County Manager Barela figured since that was best for this Representative it may be best to do a Zoom for better attendance.

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> states that he would like this presented at a Commission meeting so that there is a quorum, and all Commissioners are present. We look at the time and we can adjust the time to present the ICIP list accordingly.

<u>Madam County Manager Barela</u> asks if we will be including Senator Elect Schmedes and Representative Elect Castellano?

Chairman Schwebach replies, yes, include them as well.

<u>Cheryl Allen</u> states that she will present a presentation that she did last year with written documentation and a power point presentation.

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> asks what time frame they are looking at.

<u>Madam County Manager Barela</u> suggests that 15 minutes would be an appropriate amount of time.

<u>Chairman Schwebach</u> states that he wants to make sure there will be enough time for questions after a presentation is done, and to make sure the Representatives have a good outline of what will be done at the meeting.

The purpose of this application is the second step toward coming into compliance according to county zoning. While the zoning definition that fits is salvage yard, this application is <u>not for</u> dismantling of or storage of cars and trucks as pictured by a classical salvage yard. Specifially the special use request is for the 9.91 acres surveyed and referred to as Tract B.

No impact on adjoining properties anticipated. Noise limited to occasional operation of forklifts, etc for moving inventory and loading the occasional truck and gate bell when someone drives in. Intermittent use of chainsaw and brush chipper for internal firewood preparation. No oder save for heating stoves smoke. Modest supply of goods/materials/parts to community businesses and residents. Modest income to community businesses and governments (via services and taxes).

The property is surrounded on two sides by the Forest Service station for this area. They have open storage of inventory and equipment on the slope facing this property about 1000 feet away from ours. They have people and vehicles operating at most all hours of the day (early and late). This property is located at the edge of what is generally ranch land. The closest occupied properties have outside storage of vehicles, equipment and random stuff. Many appear to be the headquarters of ranches. The closest occupied residence is about 500 feet away and not visible due to trees and terrain. This property was originally occupied by 300 or more job corp trainees with facility constructed in about 1965 with 16 buildings of varying sizes and construction. After that, it was occupied by 30 or more employees of Ring Manufacturing. Thus our use of this property is much less active than past users.

There is one primary access gate to the property from the middle of Smith Road (AKA Red Bluff). There is a secondary seldom used gate on the North end of Smith Road and a new gate being installed toward the South end of Smith road (not expected to be in normal use). These secondary access gates are anticipated for use in emergency such as fire. The primary vehicle path is the entrance from the middle of Smith Road. This is wide enough for two vehicles and a pedestrian. Parking is generally off street after entering the property but there is additional parking space across the street and along Smith Road. Refuse pickup is once per week with the container place at the South side of the wide main entrance. There is very seldom any pedestrian traffic. Passenger vehicle traffic is typically 10 per day. Semi-truck traffic is typically less than 2 per week. Due to the overall low volume of traffic in this area, traffic control and parking are never an issue.

Water is supplied by the Town of Mountainair. The septic system is double tank serial with total capacity of 2000 gallons. Septic system is remote from any buildings and drain-field is in porous sandy soil.

Surface storm water runoff is captured in settling ponds. Vehicle fluids collected and kept in spill containment units until taken to a fluids recycler (have not collected enough in 7 years to contact recycler)

This is part of an effort to come into compliance with Torrance county Planning and Zoning for a "salvage" yard.

The purpose of this variance request is to make exception to the county's 5 acre limitation to have enough room on the current 40 acre property to allow reasonable storage of equipment and materials. A map is attached where a previous owner had a survey done for a 9.91 (often referred to as Lot B) acres of the 40 acres to be separated out for some reason. We would like to make exception to the 5 acres rule to the 9.91 acres plus the little bits of land as noted on the map (2.197 acres). The 9.91 acres area includes remaining solid buildings which cover much of the land--totaling 12.107 acres.

The reason for requesting the additional area is to make it possible for us to comply with planning and zoning in a reasonable amount of time.

Our property is immediately surrounded by land and trees at the western/outer edge of the town of Mountainair, so no glare of motion lights. The only noise is minimal especially compared to the High Schools outdoor events around the corner and down the road. Our work vehicles are used only in the daytime when needed. The Forest Service adjoins our land where they store their equipment and have people attending to its business in buildings and with vehicles coming and going all hours, though on a different street. We have no employee traffic.

Our property was previously used for Job Corps, then Ring Manufacturing used it to make filters followed by a T-shirt shop (printing) as we understand. There is no off street parking and no pedestrian traffic as nearly all sales are done online. Trucks come only when a product is to be shipped (about 1 a week) We do have FedEx pick up and UPS drop off at times. There is little traffic on our part of Red Bluff (aka Smith road).

Our refuse is provided by the town of Mountainair. Our septic system is 2,000 gallons. Our water is also provided by the town.

Notes for land use plan map 39 Red Bluff Road 87036-0293

These notes, along with the associated platt map, are intended to serve as the site development plan for this application. The site currently resembles the surrounding properties in terms of vegetation and terrain profile as it has for more than 50 years. 6 dilapidated buildings have been taken down. We don't expect this to change substantially. (All the surrounding area experienced a lot of pinion beetle kill in the last 10 years. We have removed most of the dead trees, unlike adjacent properties.)

The property generally slopes from South to North A minor arroyo runs between our property and the forest Service and takes runoff from us and the Forest Service across Red Bluff Road and eventually across highway 60.

Red Bluff road runs along the East and South sides of our property. The Forest Service is on the other two sides. There are no immediately adjacent residences. No residences are readily visible due to terrain and evergreen trees. Salvage yard portion of the property (after surveying and council approval) will total about 12 acres.

The property has more trees than is easy to count. These along with a screening fence along Red Bluff Road shield the majority of the property from public view. There are additional plants and trees from prior landscaping efforts as well as natural shrubs and trees.

The septic systems 2 tanks and double drain field are toward the West side of the property about half way between the North and South Boundaries. The original septic settling ponds located on the Forest Service property to the west our property and the associated septic lines have been demolished so the septic easements shown on the platt map no longer apply.

The city water line enters the property from the Northeast corner. Electric power comes in from the Southwest quadrant.

Surface runoff exits at the NorthWest corner via a minor valley/arroyo between our property and the Forest Service.

Off street parking and loading areas exist within the designated Salvage Yard areas sufficient for any foreseeable activity need.

No auto body stacking is anticipated nor is any dismantling of automobiles.

The wooden log fence shown on the platt map has been replaced with 8' chainlink and woven polymer screen material.

The back (North) approximately 1/3rd of the main 40 acre property (facing the Forest Service buildings) is not developed and does not have anything other than natural vegetation on it.

There are no adjacent property structures within 100 feet.

P&Z Board Recommendation November 4, 2020 Public Hearing Regarding Charles Van Leeuwen Special Use Application Salvage Yard Operation

Dear Commissioners,

On November 4, 2020 the Torrance County Planning & Zoning Board conducted a Public Hearing in accordance with Section 24 of the Torrance County Zoning Ordinance (the Ordinance). The subject of the hearing was the application for a Special Use change in zoning for Charles Van Leeuwen for the operation of a salvage yard. County Attorney John Butrick swore in all persons who testified during the public hearing. Remote participation was available via Zoom and audio teleconferencing as advertised in the public notice letters, sent to adjoining property owners, the USFS Mountainair district office, and the Town of Mountainair, and (teleconference number) in the meeting agenda. Public notice was advertised in "The Independent" in 3 editions prior to the public hearing. There were no remote participants who testified during the public hearing and no one appeared to give public comment in support of or in opposition to the application.

The subject property is described as Tract B, Lands of Lincoln Land Co., located in the NE4 of Section 1, T.3N., R.6E., NMPM having a physical address 39 Red Bluff road. Mr. Van Leeuwen is currently under Court supervision to comply with provisions of Section 16 of the Torrance County Zoning Ordinance for salvage yard operations and was, on September 2, 2020, granted a Variance to Area in excess of the 5 acre maximum size for a salvage yard. The operation consists of salvaged surplus goods such as storage tanks, metal buildings, steel frame members, pipe, etc.. Tract B is 9.98 acres and the stipulation of the P&Z Board was to consolidate all salvage material stored outdoors on to Tract B. Mr. Van Luuewen has been making progress in complying with the stipulation although there are two small areas outside the bounds of Tract B which must be cleared of materials or consolidated into Tract B by means of legal survey. Mr. Van Leeuwen reported he had been trying to locate a surveyor. The Board restated Mr. Van Leeuwen's obligation to comply with the terms of the Variance granted on September 2nd. The subject property has municipal water service from the Town of Mountainair, approved liquid waste systems for the building complex on Tract B, and solid waste services.

The Board through means of a roll call vote the P&Z Board were unanimous in a "Do Pass" recommendation as follows:

Harlan Lawson; Do Pass. Jim Frost; Do Pass. Art DuCharme; Do Pass.

The fourteen (14) day limitation for appeal of the P&Z Board's recommendation is November 18, 2020 in accordance with Section 25(B) of the Ordinance. After the Appeal period is concluded, provided no Appeal application is received, the item will appear on the County Commission consent agenda for the December 9, 2020 regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners. At that time the BOCC shall act to uphold, overturn, or remand the decision to the Zoning Board in accordance with Section 24(F) of the Ordinance.

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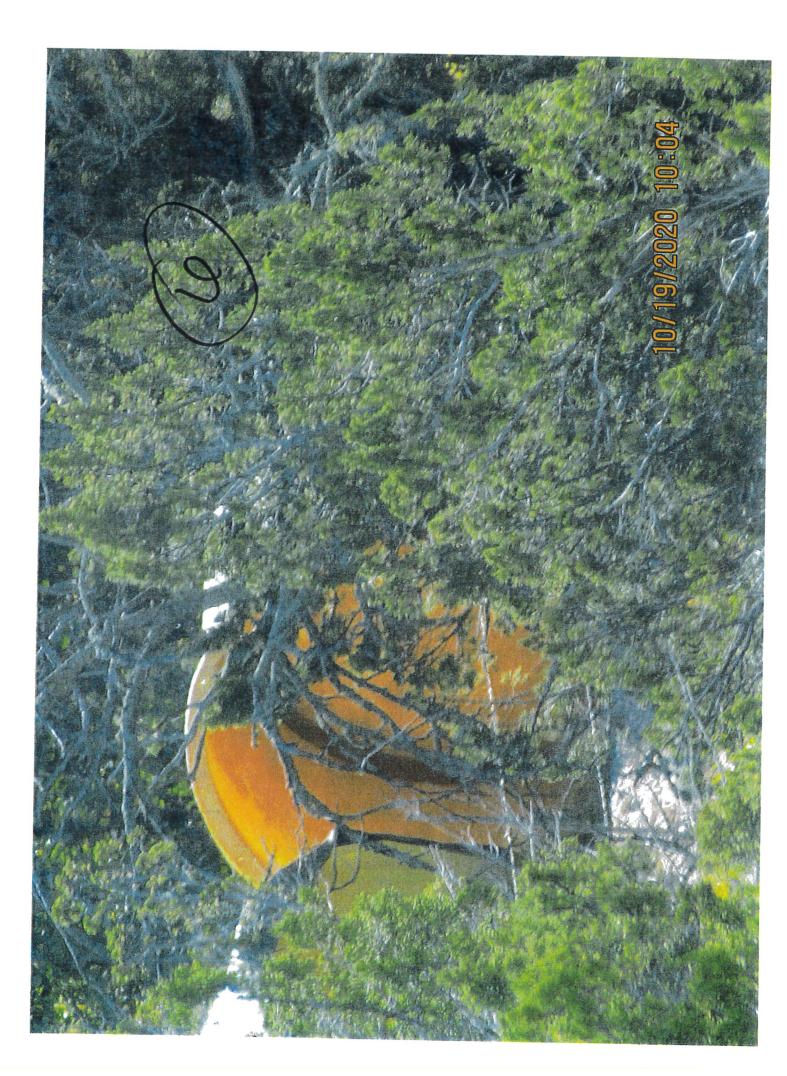


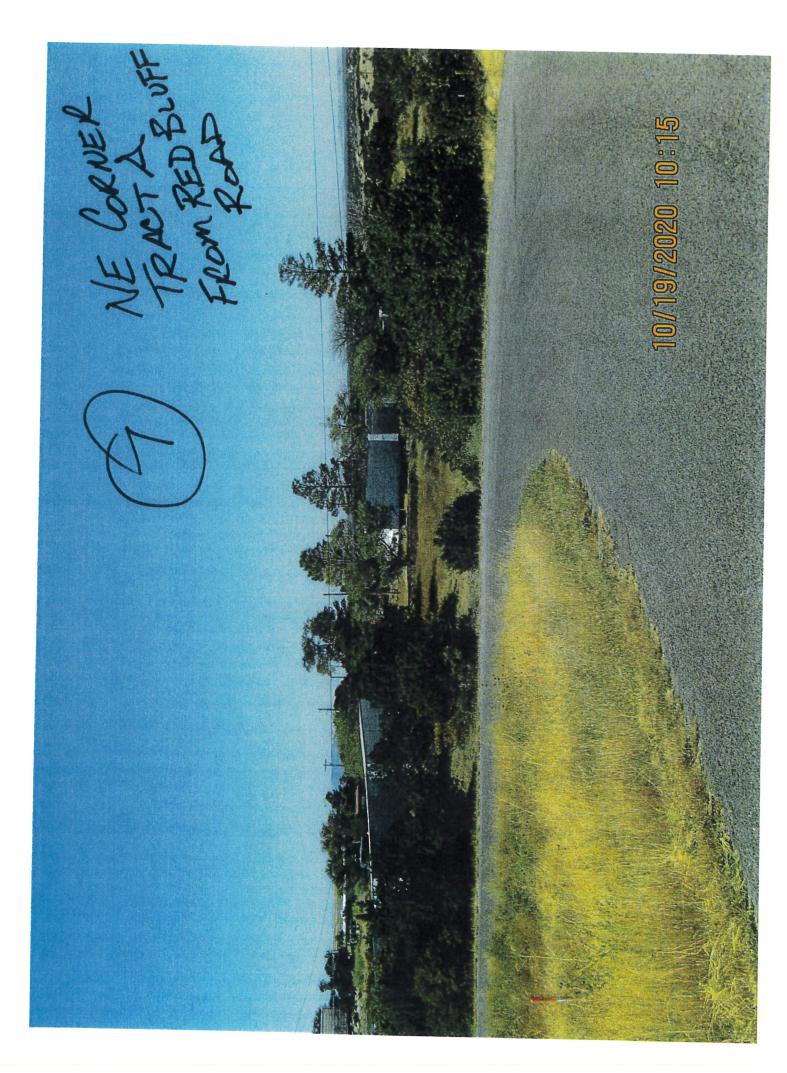


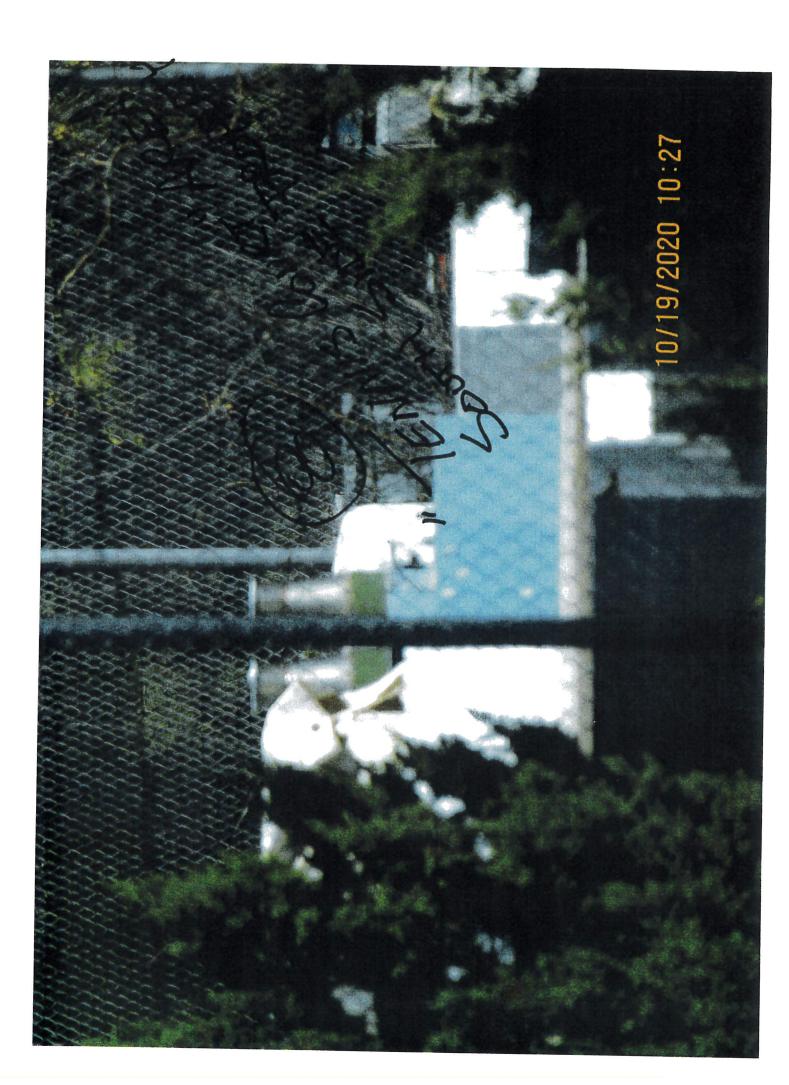














4. Variance: Create parcels smaller than district minimum standard

Chairman Lawson introduced the item. Mr. Dominguez had remained at the podium. He explained the purpose, location of the subject property, and that the zone had a 40 acre minimum. He noted that to the East and South was zone that allowed minimum 5 acre parcels. If the Variance was approved the Heckendorns would apply for a Family Transfer. Existing access and utilities were present. Chairman Lawson asked if there was anyone to speak in favor of, or opposition to the item. Via Zoom, Mrs. Heckendorn announced that she was present, and was sworn. She explained that if the Board had any questions, she was available to answer. Mr. Ducharme asked Mrs. Heckendorn the purpose of the application. Mrs. Heckendorn explained the purpose was to convey five acre parcels to two of their children so that they could live on the ranch. Mr. DuCharme asked Mr. Guetschow for clarification on granting a 5 acre variance within a Conservation District with a 40 acre minimum, and would the zone change. Mr. Guetschow explained that this application was for a Variance to Area. The Board had presided over Variances in other zone districts that had similar lot size considerations. If the Board chose to approve the variance to area, it would allow the Heckendorns to move forward with the family transfer. This was not a zoning issue other than district minimum standard lot size. Chairman Lawson asked if there were any further questions or comments from the Board. Mr. Frost made a motion to approve Action Item 4. Mr. Ducharme seconded.

Chairman Lawson began the roll call vote with Jim Frost: Aye, Art Ducharme: Aye, Chairman Harlan Lawson: Aye. All in favor. Motion carried.

Mr. Guetschow explained that being this was a Public Hearing County Attorney John Butrick would be swearing in the applicants and those providing testimony. Chairman Lawson asked for clarification of the action. Mr. Guetschow was sworn. He explained that originally the applicant had operated a recycling center that was limited to the existing buildings in the old Conservation Corps facility outside of McIntosh [Mountainair] and was in a Conservation district. Planning and Zoning had received a complaint from a citizen in that area and an investigation was initiated. Subsequently a Notice of Violation was issued. After an extended period of time a criminal complaint was filed, which was currently in the Courts. The applicant has applied for a Special Use District for a salvage yard due to the outside storage of equipment and other debris. Mr. Guetschow reminded the Board, that at the October [September] meeting the applicant came before the Board for a Variance to Area for Lot Size. This was because under County regulations a salvage yard was limited to five acres. The Board had approved the Variance for the established lot that was just under ten acres. Public Notice had been posted at the subject property and appeared in the newspaper per regulations. He referred to the photos provided in the package that he had taken October 19, 2020. These showed the applicant has been making great strides in cleaning the debris. At that time there was an individual dismantling mobile homes that were by the West gate.

Mr. Guetschow noted that his explanation was out of format order, being presented before the explanation of the application, by the applicant. Chairman Lawson asked the applicant to come forward. Mr. Charles Van Leeuwen came forward and was sworn. He explained the application was an effort to comply with the Planning & Zoning request to meet County Code. He asked if there were further questions. Mr. DuCharme asked the nature of the complaint by the neighbor and was it resolved. Mr. Guetschow explained that there were materials and salvage being stored outside. Mr. DuCharme stated this had been going on for some time. Mr. Van Leeuwen confirmed. Mr. DuCharme asked if the cleanup took care of the issue. Mr. Guetschow explained that it did not. There was still the issue of storing materials outside. Mr. DuCharme stated that as the neighbor had not shown up to complain he assumed the neighbor no longer had an issue. Mr. Guetschow explained that he could not say why the neighbor did or did not show up for the meeting. They had been informed the meeting would take place. Mr. Van Leeuwen explained there were no immediate residential neighbors. Mr. Frost noted that the Agenda stated "No decision can be rendered at this meeting." Mr. Guetschow explained past procedure where the Board would make a recommendation and the Commission would conduct the Public Hearing. This resulted in repetition and a lengthy process, for applicants to receive approval. Under the current format for a Special Use change in zoning to a parcel, the Planning & Zoning Board conducted the Public Hearing, with the applicant and those providing testimony making a single presentation and appearance instead of two. The Board would make a recommendation of "Do Pass" or "Do Not Pass" to the Commission, or defer to the next Planning & Zoning meeting if the Board felt documentation was lacking. If that recommendation was not appealed, the recommendation would appear on the Consent Agenda at the next meeting of the Commission. The Commission could approve, deny, or send the item back to the Planning & Zoning Board for further information. Under the new process the time frame for a decision for a Special Use District, was about forty-five days instead of ninety or more. If a person was aggrieved by the Planning and Zoning Board recommendation to the Commission they now had fourteen days to file an appeal instead of thirty days. If an appeal was filed it would bring a halt to the proceedings and the Commission would hear the appeal before a decision was rendered. Mr. DuCharme asked for clarification on the legal action with Mr. Van Leeuwen. Mr. Guetschow explained Mr. Van Leeuwen was currently under Court Supervision. Mr. Ducharme asked if it had been resolved through the courts. Mr. Guetschow explained this was part of that process. County Attorney John Butrick would have to answer questions regarding the legal process. County Attorney John Butrick explained the case was currently active. We were waiting to see if the Van Leeuwens get in to compliance with County Ordinance. If they do, great. If they don't, that case is there. County Attorney John Butrick explained that in regards to an appeal, if an appeal is made in that time period, they will have a Public Hearing before the County Commission and they will determine what to do. Whether that is to affirm, affirm in part, decline in part, send it back to you, whatever. If there is no appeal, then it will remain on the consent agenda. The County Commission will be free to take it off the consent agenda at any time at that meeting. If they don't, they can pass it on the consent agenda, or they can hear it if they want to, so it's completely up to them. Chairman Lawson explained there were a couple of issues last time. He realized the Special Use was for the 9.91 acres. There was still salvage material outside of this boundary. He asked Mr. Van Leeuwen what his intentions were to come in to compliance, particularly the use of the tennis court area. Mr. Van Leeuwen explained they had been trying to find a surveyor. So far they had not been able to find a surveyor that was willing to work in Torrance County. The intent was to have the tennis court and the other area surveyed, and then come back for another variance to include those areas. County Attorney John Butrick asked Mr. Guetschow is this the next step in the process of coming in to compliance. I mean after what the Van Leeuwens did a couple of months ago, and then now the Special Use district request. Is this the next step in the line of getting in to compliance with the Torrance County ordinances? Mr. Guetschow explained yes, obtaining the special use for the operation of a salvage yard. Part of that was to consolidate the materials being stored on to this nine plus acre parcel. The materials had to be moved from the tennis court area and other areas. In other areas they were in compliance for the most part, the little pocket on the East side of the property that was within that loop. When he posted the property, and took the photographic report, he took the photos from the same angles as the Variance meeting report. He repeated that they were working on dismantling the mobile homes. They were working at it but dismantling a mobile home took a little time. County Attorney John Butrick asked, so after this is approved, or not, so after the action that is made here, what is the next step for the Van Leeuwens after the action today? Mr. Guetschow explained that he would make his report to the Commission. If there was not an appeal to the Board's recommendation today within fourteen days, it would appear on the consent agenda. The Commission would approve it.

The Van Leeuwen's would have their Special Use for a Salvage Yard. Planning and Zoning would follow up to make sure that everything was stored in the area that it was supposed to be. Discussion took place as to wording of the recommendation and possible caveats for approval. Chairman Lawson asked how specific really, the Board wanted to be. The clear action was whether the Board recommended approval of the Special Use. He explained that in his opinion, a general statement could be included that within a time period, maybe six months, appropriate action be taken to come in to compliance with the areas outside of the subject tract. Rather than say there were specific actions the Van Leeuwens had to take, because there were a couple of courses of actions they could take, to come in to compliance, would be to say appropriate action be taken. If the Van Leeuwens did not come in to compliance within the given time frame the Special Use would be pulled. The Board could only take action on the 9.91 tract today for a Special Use recommendation. The Board could add the condition that they come in to compliance within the time frame. Mr. Guetschow explained that because of the violation and criminal complaint was the reason Mr. Van Leeuwen had to get the Variance to Area. The material that was stored on the larger of the two tracts had to either be removed or placed on the smaller tract that was approved in the Variance for the Salvage Yard area. Until this was done Mr. Van Leeuwen was not in compliance with the zoning violation. Mr. Guetschow clarified that the Special Use would only apply to the 9.91 acre parcel and not the larger tract. Mr. Guetschow suggested the minutes of the September 2, 2020 meeting be referred to. That was when the Variance was heard by the Board. Mr. Guetschow requested a short recess to retrieve the September 2, 2020 minutes to confirm if stipulations were put in place as condition of approval of the Variance. Chairman Lawson thought this appropriate and called recess.

10:45am Public Hearing in recess 11:10am Public Hearing back in session

Mr. Guetschow referred to the September 2, 2020 minutes. He explained a long discussion for the Variance application had taken place.

Mr. Guetschow quoted the following from the September 2, 2020 minutes:

"Chairman Lawson asked for a motion. Discussion took place in regards to conditions being placed, the court case, time Line, the special use application, another survey, and disposition of the materials on the tennis court. Vice Chairwoman Lynch made a motion to approve Action Item 5 with the contingency of some form of privacy fence. Mr. DuCharme Seconded.

Chairman Lawson began the roll call vote with Chairwoman Catherine Lynch: Aye, Art DuCharme: Aye, Jim Frost: Aye, chairman Harlan Lawson: Aye. All in favor. Motion carried."

Mr. Guetschow explained the only contingency placed on the Variance application was in regards to a privacy fence. This was a time sensitive issue because of the restrictions placed in the court case of this on the Van Leeuwen's. They were already aware from the past action for the Variance to Lot Size that the material needed to be placed on the ten acre parcel. It was the Board's discretion if they felt this needed to be reiterated in any motion made today. Chairman Lawson explained the contingency already placed was sufficient. He explained that the Board would make a "Pass" or "Do Not Pass" recommendation to the Commission based on granting Special Use of a Salvage Yard for the 9.91 acres. A vote could not take place during the Public Hearing but discussion of the motion could be done. Chairman Lawson asked Mr. Van Leeuwen if he had further comment, Mr. Van Leeuwen explained that he thought it had been said at the September Meeting but he wanted to state that no further materials were being brought in. Inventory was being reduced. They were at a stage where instead of growing, the business inventory was being reduced, moving towards shutting down. Chairman Lawson referred to earlier comments made by Mr. Van Leeuwen. Mr. Van Leeuwen's intent was to come in to compliance, to come back with a request to add the tennis court and loop area to the Special Use district. Mr. Van Leeuwen confirmed that was the intent once they were able to get a survey done. Adding the two areas would make it more likely that they could come in to compliance in time.

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Chairman Lawson explained he understood that. The Board could not take action on those properties today. Mr. Van

Leeuwen still had to come in to compliance within the time given by the court. Chairman Lawson explained there were a couple of ways this could be done. It was up to Mr. Van Leeuwen to decide what he was going to do. Chairman Lawson asked Mr. Guetschow if he had further comment, Mr. Guetschow explained that it was the goal of the County that Mr. Van Leeuwen come in to compliance with ordinance. Chairman Lawson asked for a motion to adjourn the Public Hearing. Mr. DuCharme made a motion to adjourn the Public Hearing. Mr. Frost seconded.

Chairman Lawson began the roll call vote with Jim Frost: Aye, Art Ducharme: Aye, Chairman Harlan Lawson: Aye. All in favor. Motion carried.

11:18 Public Hearing adjourned, the audio recording disk was changed. 11:20 Planning & Zoning regular business meeting back in session

Chairman Lawson asked for a motion, for a "Pass" or "Do Not Pass" recommendation to the Commission. Mr. DuCharme made a motion to support the Special Use change in zoning for a Salvage Yard, Action Item 5, with a "Do Pass" recommendation to the Commission. Mr. Frost seconded.

Chairman Lawson began the roll call vote with Jim Frost: Aye, Art Ducharme: Aye, Chairman Harlan Lawson: Aye. All in favor. Motion carried. "Do Pass" recommendation to the Commission.

Discussion Items: None
