A RESOLUTION TO PROCLAIM EXTREME OR SEVERE DROUGHT CONDITIONS WITHIN TORRANCE COUNTY AND TO BAN THE USE OF CERTAIN FIREWORKS IN THE UNINCORPORATED PORTIONS OF THE COUNTY AND WITHIN WILDLANDS IN THE COUNTY

WHEREAS, Governor Lujan Grisham issued Executive Order 2022-022 urging municipal and County governments to consider firework bans; and

WHEREAS, in recent weeks, fire danger has increased within Torrance County (the County) due to warmer temperatures, lower humidity, high winds, and an abundance of dry, fine fuels; and

WHEREAS, there are wildfires in surrounding counties resulting from the drought conditions, including the Calf Canyon Fire immediately to the North of Torrance County which has already burned in excess of 145,000 acres; and

WHEREAS, current drought indices indicate extreme, exceptional or severe drought conditions; and

WHEREAS, an immediate and present danger of range fires, brush fires, grass fires, forest fires and structure fires exist within the County due to persistent drought; and

WHEREAS, given these circumstances, the probability of ignition of materials and the spread of fire poses a severe threat to persons and property; and

WHEREAS, the health, safety and welfare of citizens are in danger as a result of such conditions; and

WHEREAS, NMSA 1978, Section 60-2C-8.1(E) provides that the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Torrance may, after hearing, declare that extreme or severe drought conditions exist, and proclaim certain restrictions on the use of fireworks.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of County Commissioners hereby resolves and proclaims as follows:

- 1. There currently exists within the unincorporated portions of the County extreme or severe drought conditions, creating a significant and immediate threat to the life, safety, health and welfare of residents of the County, and to public and private property located within the County.
- 2. The use of missile-type rockets, helicopters, aerial spinners, stick-type rockets and ground audible devices are banned within the affected drought area, which includes all unincorporated portions of the County.
- 3. The use of fireworks not listed in Paragraph 2 above is limited to areas that are paved or barren or have a readily accessible source of water for use by the homeowner or general public.
- 4. The use of all fireworks within wildlands in the County is banned, the State Forester having been consulted as required by statute and having concurred with such ban.
- 5. The use of display fireworks is banned within the unincorporated portions of the County.
- 6. Public displays of fireworks, as approved by the Torrance County Fire Chief shall be permitted.
- 7. This Resolution shall be effective for 30 days from the date below but may be reissued by the Board of County Commissioners if severe or extreme drought conditions warrant. Further, this Resolution may be modified or rescinded within the 30 days of its effectiveness if the Board of County Commissioners, after conducting an emergency hearing, determines that weather conditions have improved.

PASSED, APPROVED AND ADOPTED this 11th day of May, 2022 by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Torrance.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 2022-022

DECLARING SEVERE DROUGHT AND FIRE CONDITIONS THROUGHOUT THE STATE AND URGING MUNICIPAL AND COUNTY GOVERNMENTS TO CONSIDER FIREWORK BANS UNDER THE FIREWORKS LICENSING AND SAFETY ACT

WHEREAS, in recent weeks, fire danger has increased throughout the State due to warmer temperatures, lower humidity, high winds, and an abundance of dry, fine fuels;

WHEREAS, according to the United States Drought Monitor, approximately 93% of New Mexico is experiencing severe drought conditions, while more than 70% the State is experiencing extreme to exceptional drought conditions;

WHEREAS, significant fire danger and prevailing drought conditions create the possibility for numerous natural disasters, including severe wildfires, flooding due to severe wildfires, and crop production loss;

WHEREAS, the State is experiencing, or recently experienced, multiple large wildfires, including the Hermits Peak Fire, the McBride Fire, the Nogal Fire, the Calf Canyon Fire, the Cooks Peak Fire, and the Big Hole Fire;

WHEREAS, federal authorities have recently enacted early measures to respond to increased fire danger in the State by issuing Stage I and Stage II fire restrictions on federal lands; and

WHEREAS, tribal governments have also imposed fire restrictions on their lands.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michelle Lujan Grisham, Governor of the State of New Mexico,

by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State of New Mexico do hereby **DECLARE** severe drought and fire conditions exist throughout New Mexico and **URGE** New Mexico's counties, municipalities, and local governments to consider implementing appropriate firework bans pursuant to the Fireworks Safety and Licensing Act, NMSA 1978, §§ 60-2C-1 to -11, as well as any other appropriate fire prevention measures that they may legally enact.

I FURTHER ORDER and DIRECT as follows:

- 1. This Order supersedes any previous orders, proclamations, or directives to the extent they are in conflict.
- 2. This Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect until renewed, modified, or rescinded.

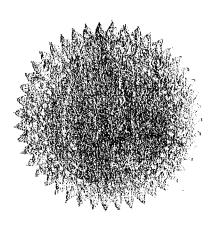

A RESOLUTION DECLARING A FIRE DANGER EMERGENCY AND PROHIBITING ALL OPEN FIRES

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of Torrance County has obtained information and forecasts from the National Weather Service as well as the United States Forest Service and New Mexico State Forestry Division concerning drought conditions, and ongoing critical fire weather; and,

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 Pandemic has increased the stress on available resources to respond to any fire incident; and

WHEREAS, there is an unacceptable risk to first responders and the public due to any response during the COVID-19 Pandemic because of the close proximity of responders and of the public who may be housed in temporary or emergency shelters; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager recommends to the Board of County Commissioners that a Fire Danger Emergency exists due to dry conditions and the threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the public, should a fire event happen during the COVID-19 emergency.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Torrance County Commission hereby declares a "Fire Danger Emergency" as defined by and under the authority of Torrance County Ordinance 87-2 Section 5B. All open fires are prohibited for the duration of the COVID-19 emergency. This restriction does not apply to ceremonial, barbecuing, heating in fireplaces, and warming at construction sites as defined by Ordinance 87-2 Section 4D, (2) through (6).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Improper Handling of Fire is prohibited criminally under Section 30-17-1, NMSA 1978.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT Estancia Valley Youth & Family Council (EVYFC) BOYS COUNCIL SERVICES IN THE ESTANCIA VALLEY

RFP TC-FY22-02

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the County of Torrance, hereinafter referred to as the "County" and <u>Albert Lovato</u>, 806 <u>Loring Ave</u>, <u>Estancia</u>, <u>NM 87016</u>, hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor", and is effective as of the date set forth below upon which it is executed by the Board of County Commissioners.

WHEREAS, the County of Torrance is the government entity in Torrance County receiving and administering funds from the New Mexico Children, Youth and Families Department, hereinafter referred to as "CYFD," for a continuum of graduate sanction and alternative detention services to juvenile offenses.

WHEREAS, the terms of said agreement require compliance with all applicable Federal and State laws, rules, and regulations, and

WHEREAS, there is an on-going need for professional services necessary to perform the Statement of Work as set out herein; and,

NOW THEREFORE, the County and the Contractor in consideration of mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, do hereby agree as follows:

IT IS AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES:

1. Period of Agreement.

This Agreement shall become effective upon approval of the Board of County Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as the "Board," and shall automatically renew on July 1 each fiscal year for two (2) additional one-year terms, and shall expire on June 30, 2024, unless terminated pursuant to Articles 4 or 8, infra. In accordance with Section 13-1-150 NMSA 1978, no term for a professional services contract, including extensions and renewals, shall exceed four (4) years, except as set forth in Section 13-1-150 NMSA 1978. This procurement may result in a multi-source award.

2. Statement of Work

The Contractor shall provide the program of services as set forth in the scope of work, which is attached hereto as "Attachment 1 – Statement of Work" and incorporated herein by reference, unless amended or terminated pursuant to Articles 4 or 8, infra.

3. <u>Limitation of Cost and Compensation</u>

A. The total amount made payable to the Contractor under this Agreement, excluding gross receipts tax and expenses, shall not exceed twenty-nine thousand, seven hundred dollars and zero cents [\$29,700 (\$165.00 per session x 180 sessions) for any fiscal year period and as approved by CYFD in Agreement No. 21-690-3200-20847. The annual budget is attached hereto as "Attachment 2 – Budget" and incorporated herein by

reference. Payments shall only be made as outlined in "Attachment 2 – Budget." This amount is a maximum and not a guarantee that the work assigned to the Contractor under this Agreement to be performed shall equal the amount stated herein.

- B. The County shall pay to the Contractor in full payment for services satisfactorily performed pursuant to the "Statement of Work Attachment 1." The New Mexico gross receipts tax levied on the amounts payable under this Agreement shall be paid by the County to the Contractor. The Contractor is responsible for all expenses. All invoices MUST BE received by the County no later than five (5) days after the end of each month. The invoice reporting June activity shall be submitted five (5) business days prior to the end of the fiscal year (June 30) and at the termination of the Fiscal Year. Invoices received after such date WILL NOT BE PAID.
- C. Contractor must submit a detailed statement of accounting for all services performed incurred. If the County finds that the services are not acceptable, within thirty days after the date of receipt of written notice from the Contractor that payment is requested, the County shall provide the Contractor a letter of exception explaining the defect or objection to the services and outlining steps the Contractor may take to provide remedial action. Upon certification by the County that the services have been rendered and are acceptable, payment shall be tendered to the Contractor within thirty days after the date of acceptance.

4. **Appropriations.**

The terms of this Agreement are contingent upon sufficient appropriations and authorization being made by the Legislature of New Mexico and CYFD for the performance of this Agreement. If sufficient appropriations and authorization are not made by the Legislature and CYFD, this Agreement shall terminate immediately upon written notice being given by the County to the Contractor. The County's decision as to whether sufficient appropriations are available shall be accepted by the Contractor and shall be final. If the County proposes an amendment to the Agreement to unilaterally reduce funding, the Contractor shall have the option to terminate the Agreement or to agree to the reduced funding within thirty (30) days of receipt of the proposed amendment.

5. Status of Contractor.

The Contractor and its agents and employees are independent contractors performing professional services for the County and are not employees of the County. The Contractor and its agents and employees shall not accrue leave, retirement, insurance, bonding, use of County vehicles, or any other benefits afforded to employees of the County as a result of this Agreement. The Contactor shall obtain a DUNS Number and be listed as active in the System for Award Management (SAM) prior to contract award. The Contractor acknowledges that all sums received hereunder are reportable by the Contractor for tax purposes, including without limitation, self-employment and business income tax. The Contractor agrees not to purport to bind the County unless the Contractor has express written authority to do so, and then only within the strict limits of that authority.

6. Assignment.

The Contractor shall not assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement or assign any claims for money due or to become due under this Agreement without the prior written approval of the County.

7. Subcontracting.

The Contractor shall not subcontract any portion of the services to be performed under this Agreement without the prior written approval of the County. No such subcontract shall relieve the primary Contractor from its obligations and liabilities under this Agreement, nor shall any subcontract obligate direct payment from the County. In all cases, the contractor is solely responsible for fulfillment of this Agreement.

8. Release.

Final payment of the amounts due under this Agreement shall operate as a release of the procuring agency of the County, its officers and employees, and the County of Torrance from all liabilities, claims and obligations whatsoever arising from or under this Agreement.

9. Confidentiality.

Any confidential information provided to or developed by the Contractor in the performance of this Agreement shall be kept confidential and shall not be made available to any individual or organization by the Contractor without the prior written approval of the County.

10. Product of Service -- Copyright.

All materials developed or acquired by the Contractor under this Agreement shall become the property of the County of Torrance and shall be delivered to the County no later than the termination date of this Agreement. Nothing developed or produced, in whole or in part, by the Contractor under this Agreement shall be the subject of an application for copyright or other claim of ownership by or on behalf of the Contractor.

11. Conflict of Interest; Governmental Conduct Act.

- A. The Contractor represents and warrants that it presently has no interest and, during the term of this Agreement, shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance or services required under the Agreement.
- B. The Contractor further represents and warrants that it has complied with, and, during the term of this Agreement, will continue to comply with, and that this Agreement complies with all applicable provisions of the Governmental Conduct Act, Chapter 10, Article 16 NMSA 1978. Without in anyway limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Contractor specifically represents and warrants that:
 - 1) in accordance with Section 10-16-4.3 NMSA 1978, the Contractor does not employ, has not employed, and will not employ

- during the term of this Agreement any County employee while such employee was or is employed by the County and participating directly or indirectly in the County's contracting process;
- this Agreement complies with Section 10-16-7(B) NMSA 1978 because (i) the Contractor is not a public officer or employee of the County; (ii) the Contractor is not a member of the family of a public officer or employee of the County; (iii) the Contractor is not a business in which a public officer or employee or the family of a public officer or employee has a substantial interest; or (iv) if the Contractor is a public officer or employee of the County, a member of the family of a public officer or employee of the County, or a business in which a public officer or employee of the County or the family of a public officer or employee of the County has a substantial interest, public notice was given as required by Section 10-16-7(B) NMSA 1978 and this Agreement was awarded pursuant to a competitive process;
- 3) in accordance with Section 10-16-8(C) NMSA 1978, (i) the Contractor is not, and has not been represented by, a person who has been a public officer or employee of the County within the preceding year and whose official act directly resulted in this Agreement and (ii) the Contractor is not, and has not been assisted in any way regarding this transaction by, a former public officer or employee of the County whose official act, while in County employment, directly resulted in the County's making this Agreement;
- 4) in accordance with Section 10-16-13 NMSA 1978, the Contractor has not directly participated in the preparation of specifications, qualifications or evaluation criteria for this Agreement or any procurement related to this Agreement; and
- 5) in accordance with Section 10-16-3 and Section 10-16-13.3 NMSA 1978, the Contractor has not contributed, and during the term of this Agreement shall not contribute, anything of value to a public officer or employee of the County.
- C. Contractor's representations and warranties in Paragraphs A and B of this Article 12 are material representations of fact upon which the County relied when this Agreement was entered into by the parties. Contractor shall provide immediate written notice to the County if, at any time during the term of this Agreement, Contractor learns that Contractor's representations and warranties in Paragraphs A and B of this Article 12 were erroneous on the effective date of this Agreement or have become erroneous by reason of new or changed circumstances. If it is later determined that Contractor's representations and warranties in Paragraphs A and B of this Article 12 were erroneous on the effective date of this Agreement or have become erroneous by reason of new or changed circumstances, in addition to other remedies available to the County and notwithstanding anything in the Agreement to the contrary, the County may immediately terminate the Agreement.

D. All terms defined in the Governmental Conduct Act have the same meaning in this Article 12(B).

12. Amendment.

This Agreement shall not be altered, changed or amended except by instrument in writing executed by the parties hereto and all other required signatories.

13. Merger.

This Agreement incorporates all the Agreements, covenants and understandings between the parties hereto concerning the subject matter hereof, and all such covenants, Agreements and understandings have been merged into this written Agreement. No prior Agreement or understanding, oral or otherwise, of the parties or their agents shall be valid or enforceable unless embodied in this Agreement.

14. Penalties for violation of law.

The Procurement Code, Sections 13-1-28 through 13-1-199, NMSA 1978, imposes civil and criminal penalties for its violation. In addition, the New Mexico criminal statutes impose felony penalties for illegal bribes, gratuities and kickbacks.

15. Equal Opportunity Compliance.

The Contractor agrees to abide by all federal, state and county laws and rules and regulations, pertaining to equal employment opportunity. In accordance with all such laws, the Contractor assures that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, age, physical or mental handicap, or serious medical condition, spousal affiliation, sexual orientation or gender identity, be excluded from employment with or participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity performed under this Agreement. If Contractor is found not to be in compliance with these requirements during the life of this Agreement, Contractor agrees to take appropriate steps to correct these deficiencies.

16. Applicable Law.

In any action, suit or legal dispute arising from this Agreement, the Contractor agrees that the laws of the State of New Mexico shall govern and that venue will lie in the Seventh Judicial District Court in Torrance County. By execution of this Agreement, Contractor acknowledges and agrees to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of New Mexico over any and all lawsuits arising under or out of any term of this Agreement.

17. Workers Compensation.

The Contractor agrees to comply with state laws and rules applicable to workers compensation benefits for its employees. If the Contractor fails to comply with the Workers Compensation Act and applicable rules when required to do so, this Agreement may be terminated by the County.

18. Records and Financial Audit.

The Contractor shall maintain detailed time and expenditure records that indicate the date; time, nature and cost of services rendered during the Agreement's term and effect and retain them for a period of three (3) years from the date of final payment under this Agreement. The records shall be subject to inspection by the County, the Department of Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. The County shall have the right to audit billings both before and after payment. Payment under this Agreement shall not foreclose the right of the County to recover excessive or illegal payments

19. <u>Disclaimer and Hold Harmless.</u>

Torrance County shall not be liable to the Contractor, or the Contractor's successors, heirs, administrators, or assigns, for any loss, damage, or injury, whether to Contractor's person or property, occurring in connection with Contractor's performance of Contractor's duties according to this Agreement. Contractor shall hold the Torrance County harmless from all loss, damage, and injury, including court costs and attorney fees, incurred by Torrance County in connection with the performance by Contractor of Contractor's duties according to this Agreement.

20. Indemnification.

The Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County of Torrance from all actions, proceeding, claims, demands, costs, damages, attorneys' fees and all other liabilities and expenses of any kind from any source which may arise out of the performance of this Agreement, caused by the negligent act or failure to act of the Contractor, its officers, employees, servants, subcontractors or agents, or if caused by the actions of any client of the Contractor resulting in injury or damage to persons or property during the time when the Contractor or any officer, agent, employee, servant or subcontractor thereof has or is performing services pursuant to this Agreement. In the event that any action, suit or proceeding related to the services performed by the Contractor or any officer, agent, employee, servant or subcontractor under this Agreement is brought against the Contractor, the Contractor shall, as soon as practicable but no later than two (2) days after it receives notice thereof, notify the legal counsel of the County of Torrance and the New Mexico Association of Counties by certified mail.

21. Invalid Term or Condition.

If any term or condition of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected and shall be valid and enforceable.

22. Enforcement of Agreement.

A party's failure to require strict performance of any provision of this Agreement shall not waive or diminish that party's right thereafter to demand strict compliance with that or any other provision. No waiver by a party of any of its rights under this Agreement shall be effective unless express and in writing, and no effective waiver by a party of any of its rights shall be effective to waive any other rights.

23. Authority.

If Contractor is other than a natural person, the individual(s) signing this Agreement on behalf of Contractor represents and warrants that he or she has the power and authority to bind Contractor, and that no further action, resolution, or approval from Contractor is necessary to enter into a binding contract.

24. <u>Lobbying.</u>

No federal appropriated funds can be paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the CONTRACTOR, or any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any County, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, or the making of any Federal grant, the making of any federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement. If any funds other than federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any County, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection of this federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the CONTRACTOR shall complete and submit Standard Form LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

25. Approval of Contractor Personnel.

Personnel proposed in the Contractor's written proposal to the County are considered material to any work performed under this Agreement. No changes of personnel will be made by the Contractor without prior written consent of the procuring agency of the County. Replacement of any Contractor personnel, if approved, shall be with personnel of equal ability, experience and qualifications. The Contractor will be responsible for any expenses incurred in familiarizing the replacement personnel to insure their being productive to the project immediately upon receiving assignments. Approval of replacement personnel shall not be unreasonably withheld. The procuring agency of the County shall retain the right to request the removal of any of the Contractor's personnel at any time.

26. Survival.

The agreement paragraphs titled "Patent, Copyright, Trademark, and Trade Secret Indemnification" and "Indemnification" shall survive the expiration of this agreement. Software licenses, leases, maintenance and any other unexpired agreements that were entered into under the terms and conditions of this agreement shall survive this agreement

27. Succession.

This agreement shall extend to and be binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties.

28. Force Majeure.

A party shall be excused from performance under this agreement for any period that the party is prevented from performing as a result of an act of God, strike, war, civil disturbance, epidemic, or court order, provided that the party has prudently and promptly acted to take any and all steps that are within the party's control to ensure performance. Subject to this provision, such non-performance shall not be deemed a default or a ground for termination.

29. Mediation.

In the event a dispute arises as to the rights and obligations among the parties hereto, the parties agree to attempt to resolve the dispute through mediation as a condition precedent to seeking legal and equitable remedies. The parties agree to evenly split the costs of any such mediation services. The parties shall mutually agree upon the choice of mediator. In the event the parties have not agreed upon a mediator within twenty (20) days of written notice to the other regarding the dispute, then a list of seven potential mediators will be obtained from the New Mexico Association of Counties and the parties shall utilize a striking process until a mediator is agreed upon.

30. Notice to Proceed.

It is expressly understood that this Agreement is not binding upon the County until it is executed by the Board of County Commissioners after voting on the contract at a public meeting. The Contractor is not to proceed with its obligations under the Agreement until the Contractor has received a fully signed copy of the Agreement.

31. Attorney's Fees.

In the event this Agreement results in dispute, mediation, litigation, or settlement between the parties to this Agreement, the prevailing party of such action shall NOT be entitled to an award of attorneys' fees and court costs.

32. Cooperation.

All parties hereto will fully cooperate with the other and their respective counsel, accountant, and agents in connection with any steps required to be taken under this Agreement.

33. <u>Incorporation and Order of Precedence.</u>

Request for Proposals No. TC-FY22-02 and the contractor's proposal are incorporated by reference into this agreement and are made a part of this agreement. In the event of any conflict among these documents, the following order of precedence shall apply:

- 1. Any contract amendment(s), in reverse chronological order; then
- 2. this contract itself; then
- 3. the Request for Proposals; then
- 4. the Contractors Best and Final Offer(s), in reverse chronological order; then
- 5. the contractor's proposal; then

6. the contractor's standard agreement terms and conditions (which may or may not have been submitted as part of the contractor's proposal).

34. Patent, Copyright, Trademark and Trade Secret Indemnification.

- A. The contractor shall defend, at its own expense, the County of Torrance against any claim that any product or service provided under this agreement infringes any patent, copyright or trademark in the United States or Puerto Rico, and shall pay all costs, damages and attorneys' fees that a court finally awards as a result of any such claim. In addition, if any third party obtains a judgment against the County of Torrance based upon the contractor's trade secret infringement relating to any product or service provided under this agreement, the contractor agrees to reimburse the County of Torrance for all costs, attorneys' fees and the amount of the judgment. To qualify for such defense and/or payment, the County of Torrance shall:
- i. give the contractor prompt written notice of any claim;
- ii. allow the contractor to control the defense or settlement of the claim; and
 - iii. cooperate with the contractor in a reasonable way to facilitate the defense or settlement of the claim.
- B. If any product or service becomes, or in the contractor's opinion is likely to become the subject of a claim of infringement, the contractor shall at its option and expense:
- i. provide a procuring agency of the County the right to continue using the product or service;
- ii. replace or modify the product or service so that it becomes non-infringing; or
- iii. accept the return of the product or service and refund an amount equal to the depreciated value of the returned product or service, less the unpaid portion of the purchase price and any other amounts which are due to the contractor. The contractor's obligation will be void as to any product or service modified by the procuring agency of the County to the extent such modification is the cause of the claim.

35. Professional Liability Insurance.

Contractor agrees to maintain in full force throughout the duration of the Agreement a professional liability insurance policy with a minimum coverage of \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence/ \$2,000,000.00 aggregate.

36. Contractor's Payment of Property Taxes.

Contractor acknowledges that County has established a policy of ensuring that all individuals and businesses that benefit financially from County through contract are current in paying their property tax obligations to mitigate the economic burden otherwise imposed upon County and its taxpayers. Contractor warrants and certifies that it is presently not delinquent in the payment of its property tax obligations, and that it will not become delinquent during the term of this Contract.

37. Termination For Failure to Comply with All County Tax Requirements.

Without limiting the rights and remedies available to County under any other provision of this contract, failure of Contractor to cure a tax delinquency within 10 days of notice shall be grounds upon which County may terminate this Contract.

38. Notices.

Any notice required to be given to either party by this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered in person, by courier service or by U.S. mail, either first class or certified, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, as follows:

Attachment 1 – Statement of Work

Torrance County

The Torrance County Board of County Commissioners, herein after known as "Board," is contracting for a Facilitator, herein after known as "Facilitator" or "Contractor" for the Gender-Specific Boys Council Program, hereinafter referred to as "Program," administered in the Estancia Valley, New Mexico, that serves youth ages 11-17 who are at risk of becoming involved in the Juvenile Justice System and have been identified by a parent, counselor, social worker, and/or courts to be at such risk or who could benefit from the Program. The Program shall utilize the One Circle Foundation Council Model called The Council for Boys and Young Men that is recognized as a "promising practice" and serves to empower at-risk teenage boys by improving their self-esteem and teaching them communication and decision-making skills. The Contractor takes direction and supervision from Torrance County, herein after known as the "County," however, the contract will be executed, modified or terminated, with the approval of the Board.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Duties and Responsibilities of the Boys Council Facilitator

- 1. Fulfills all goals, objectives, and activities of the Gender-Specific Boys Council Program as specified by the County, Children Youth, and Families Department (CYFD, and the Agreement between the County and CYFD. Work closely with and under supervision of the Estancia Valley Youth & Families Council (EVYFC) Continuum Coordinator, herein after known as the "Continuum Coordinator," to ensure all quality standards and goals are met. Shall provide quarterly updates to the EVYFC at a regularly scheduled board meeting or upon proper written notice.
- 2. Each Council session shall run for eight (8) to twelve (12) weeks for a minimum of one (1) hour per week. Sessions must include an activity from the facilitator manual.
- 3. Submit the Data Collection Form no later than the 5th day of the following month, a summary report upon completion of the Program, including performance outcomes and the number of youth to complete the Program successfully.
- 4. Submit a weekly attendance form for each session to the Continuum Coordinator by 5:00 p.m. the following day after the session is conducted.
- 5. Print and file each participant's monthly log by the 5th day of the following month.
- 6. Conduct One Circle Foundation approved entry and exit surveys (The Council Survey) for each participant.
- 7. Complete a Youth and Staff Survey for each youth and submit to be recorded into an approved CYFD platform upon completion of each program and maintain a hardcopy on file for audit purposes.
- 8. Conduct retention calls to the parents or guardians of each participant to build a relationship with the parent or guardian as well as to discuss the progress of their participating child.

- 9. Provide other data and information as may be requested or required by CYFD and/or the Continuum Coordinator.
- 10. Upon successful completion of the Program, issue a certificate to each participant and obtain an evaluation form from each participant.
- 11. Inclusion and reference the CYFD and EVYFC logo in any correspondence and media communications.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- General Terms. TriWest Fence LLC or its subsidiary ("CONTRACTOR") agrees to provide the labor and materials (collectively the "WORK") specified on the proposal set forth on the reverse side hereof (the "front page") within a reasonable time. BUYER agrees to pay the amount shown in current U.S. funds upon substantial completion of the work per the payment terms on the reverse side hereof.
- Installation of Fence. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing, BUYER shall fully cooperate in allowing CONTRACTOR'S installation of the fence by doing each of the following: (a) clearing a sufficient working area of all obstructions and removable hazards; (b) surveying, grading, locating and staking the fence line and by verifying all property lines and identifying all utility lines; (c) notifying CONTRACTOR'S crew of all potential work area hazards; (d) coordinating CONTRACTOR'S work with the activities of all other persons at the job site, including others contractors, crews, supervisors, architects and owners; and (e) obtaining all appropriate building permits or other form of governmental permission. The estimated completion date shall be extended for as long as BUYER fails to comply with this provision, and for all delays reasonably beyond CONTRACTOR'S control. BUYER shall be deemed to have accepted the goods and work performed upon payment in full.
- 3 Payment, Default and Remedies. If BUYER does not make payment in full upon substantial completion, CONTRACTOR may pursue any and all collection activity ft deems necessary to collect on BUYERS obligation. BUYER shall be responsible for all costs of collection, including but not limited to, all collection agency charges, court costs, attorneys' fees and lien fees, and all costs and attorneys' fees incurred in collecting upon any judgment. Interest will accrue on all unpaid balances, lien expenses, collection expenses and attorneys' fees from the date incurred at the rate of twenty-one percent (21%) per year or at the highest rate allowed by applicable law. CONTRACTOR may apply all payment or portions thereof to any outstanding attorney fees, court costs, collection expenses, interest and principal as CONTRACTOR, in its sole discretion, deems appropriate. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State and County in which the project is located.
- 4 Changes and BUYER'S Cancellation. If BUYER requests any change in the type, quality or quantity of the fencing to be provided by CONTRACTOR hereunder, BUYER shall pay, in addition to the purchase price shown on the front page, CONTRACTORS standard charge for all additional fence and for such additional labor material and travel expenses as are incurred by CONTRACTOR in connection with such change. If, prior to CONTRACTOR'S delivery of the fencing, BUYER shall be obligated to pay CONTRACTOR, as liquidated damages and a restocking fee, but not as a penalty, the amount equal to twenty-five percent (25%) of the CONTRACTOR'S standard charge for all special order materials. After CONTRACTOR has begun delivery of the fence, but before installation has begun, BUYER may cancel this Agreement by paying CONTRACTOR, as liquidated damages and as a restocking and transportation fee, but not as a penalty, the amount equal to fifty percent (50%) of the purchase price shown on the front page.
- 5 Cumulative Remedies. To the greatest extent permitted by applicable law, BUYERS obligation hereunder and all of CONTRACTOR's rights and remedies provided by herein and/or by applicable law, are cumulative, and CONTRACTOR shall be entitled to exercise any and all rights and remedies. BUYER acknowledges that its obligation to pay CONTRACTOR is an independent covenant, and BUYER acknowledges that it shall have no offset rights and may not withhold payment of any monies owing to CONTRACTOR hereunder. Nothing herein, however, shall be construed to release CONTRACTOR from any obligation which it may owe to BUYER.
- 6 Lien Rights. BUYER acknowledges that CONTRACTOR has and may exercise all lien rights against the property upon which the work is performed. To the greatest extent permitted by law, BUYER and/or OWNER hereby waive any and all objections to any defects in any such lien documents. Contractor's exercise or non-exercise of such lien rights will not alter or amend this Agreement or release any of Buyer's obligations hereunder.
- Amendments; Walvers; Entire Agreement. Except by a specific written document executed by the parties hereto, none of the terms, covenants, representations, warranties or conditions hereof may be walved, amended, modified, superseded or canceled. Forbearance or delay shall not be deemed a walver. A single or partial exercise of any right or remedy shall not preclude further exercise thereof or of any other right or remedy. Any written waiver shall be strictly construed and shall not be extendable. This Agreement contains the parties' entire understanding and supersedes and replaces all prior and contemporaneous agreements and understandings, oral written or implied. All documents and instruments created hereafter and concerning this transaction, including any one or more work orders or purchase orders, shall not prevail over the terms of this Agreement.
- 8 Limited Warranty. All goods, supplied are warranted to be fit for the intended purposes for which such goods are used for a period of one (1) year. THERE ARE NO WARRANTIES WHICH EXTEND BEYOND THE DESCRIPTION OF THE GOODS AND WORK TO BE PERFORMED AS CONTAINED ON THE FRONT PAGE. BUYER shall have no claim for incidental, consequential, special or proximate damages.
- 9 Indemnity. To the greatest extent permitted by law, BUYER shall indemnify, defend, hold and save CONTRACTOR (and its officers, shareholders, directors, agents, employees, servants and independent contractors) harmless from all claims and expenses, including court costs and attorneys' fees, for damages or injuries to persons or property which are related in any manner, directly or indirectly to this Agreement or to the fence (including its location) regardless of whether the injury or damage is caused in part by CONTRACTOR's negligence or any other act or omission of CONTRACTOR or it agents, provided however, that BUYER shall not be obligated to indemnify CONTRACTOR for his sole negligence or willful misconduct.
- 10 Successors and Assigns. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns of the parties hereto.
- Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is held unenforceable, CONTRACTOR may sever from this Agreement the language which makes such provision unenforceable and this Agreement shall be construed as if it did not contain the language and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be enforced accordingly.
